## Sudlersville Commission Meeting

July 6, 2022

Red Speed-A report from Lt Meil. One month violations-542. Operating from 6am to 4pm. The Towns portion of tickets is \$10,840.

Trash-Keith said we were having issues with our current service-Eastern Shore Environmental. The contract with ESE ends soon. The owner was asked to attend tonight's meeting, but did not.

Commissioner Haag has been researching trash companies and other similar issues in surrounding towns. Big Tyme Trash employees attended the meeting explained their process and how they got started. He said recycling is not always dumped where it should be.

After some discussion Commissioner Haag made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner McMullen to contract Big Tyme Trash for a two month period until we can get an RFP out to solicit a permanent company. The motion passed.
