Sudlersville Commissioners meeting 1/4/2023

Commissioner Griffith called the meeting to order at 1830.

Commissioner Haag led the pledge of allegiance.

Commissioner Haag made a motion to approve the minutes from the December meeting. Commissioner Habel seconded; the rest followed. All in favor.

REPORTS:

Fire Department: Elections happened at the firehouse, Angelini is still the chief. A few fundraisers are coming up.
